

DRINKING AND DRIVING—A DEADLY COMBINATION

There are many ways to communicate the message that drinking and driving don't mix. Below are two possibilities. Select one, and follow the steps.

Option 1—A Multimedia Report

1. Read the article at the Web site labeled "Drunk Driving Statistics." Write down at least five important facts that you learned.
2. Organize the facts into a five-minute oral report that details the chilling consequences of driving under the influence. For added impact, visit the Web site labeled "Crash Test Footage" and download the movie. Allow your audience to view the film in small groups. As an alternative, create original artwork to drive home your point.
