Middle School

Team-Teaching Strategy

Materials needed are lightweight cardboard, colored pencils and markers, scissors, shoeboxes, tape, and Internet access.

Use the Internet to view a photo of Dr. King delivering the speech “I Have a Dream” in Washington, D.C. Here’s the link you’ll need:

This photograph shows Dr. King delivering the speech “I Have a Dream” in Washington, D.C. Take special note of the foreground, middle ground, and background in the picture. Make separate drawings of the three sections on cardboard and cut out the drawings, including tabs on the bottom.

Next, make three rows of slits, one row in front of the other, in one side of a shoebox. Then fit the tabs inside the slits, creating a three dimensional picture of Dr. King giving his speech. Secure the tabs with tape on the underside of the diorama.
